

Oscar Anderson

Oscar Anderson was born on May 30th, 1893. He was in Howard lake Minnesota to Swedish immigrants. Before the war Oscar was a salesman and law student with the New England Furniture and Carpet Company. During this time he lived on 632 East 14th Street in Minneapolis Minnesota.

Oscar was inducted into service on June 15th, 1918 at the age of 25 in Saint Paul Minnesota as a private in the army. He was assigned to the 1st Company of the University of Minnesota. He was stationed there from June 15th, 1918 to August 15th, 1918. After his time here he then went to the Washington Barracks in Washington DC where he resided from August 18th, 1918 to November 8th, 1918. On November 11th, 1918 he was transferred to Camp Grant. On February 15th, 1919 he was promoted from Private to 2nd Lieutenant in the reserve Corps. Oscar never saw combat overseas during the First World War.

After the war ended Oscar resumed his life back in Minnesota. He kept working at the New England Furniture and Carpet Company. Oscar moved to Howard Lake Minnesota after the war. On October 29th, 1960 Oscar Anderson passed away.
